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<u>About my Classes:</u>

In my class, students progress through the assignments, projects and labs weekly. If a student gets behind on assignments in class, then he or she should work at home to get caught up. All of the assignments may be turned in at any point up until the end of the quarter; however, there is a 10% penalty for late work.

<u>Google Classroom:</u>

All assignments will be accessible through Google Classroom, so students can work on them at school and at home. I will have paper handouts available for students who wish to complete their assignments on paper instead of typing them; however, lab reports must be typed.

Independent Project



Each semester, students will be assigned an "Independent Project." This project will be due by the last week of the semester. The purpose of the project to allow students to complete more in-depth research on one of the topics we will be studying in class and to present what they have learned in a creative way.
